- we write what the hard word means.

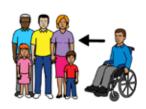


About this booklet

- be safe and get a fair go



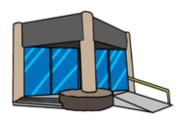
- contribute

- said yes to 4 Changing Places areas at train stations in the new Melbourne tunnel
 - Changing Places are areas that people with disability can use for their personal care needs.

We want you to live well

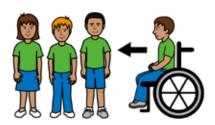


In 2017 we

 worked with Family Planning Victoria to help people with disability in schools learn about sex and health



 made a program for people with disability to get help for mental health problems



- helped about 50 groups to include people with disability in community programs
 - for example, sport clubs



 helped Cricket Victoria to host the finals for cricketers with disability in Geelong.

We also



- said yes to about 6000 new homes for vulnerable people
 - vulnerable means people who have a disability or do **not** have much money



- helped people with disability get ready for the NDIS
 - NDIS means the National Disability
 Insurance Scheme



 made a plan to help Victorians get NDIS jobs.

In 2017 we

 worked with Brain Injury Australia to learn about family violence and brain injury



 worked with RMIT to make places that are safe for people with disability



 helped people who live with family violence



- supported advocates to help people with disability
 - advocates help people understand information and make decisions.



We also

- made a plan to stop abuse of people with disability
 - abuse means a person is hurt



 worked on a program to make sure disability workers have the right skills and education



made more rules about checks on disability workers



 worked with Victoria Police to help people with disability report abuse and crime.

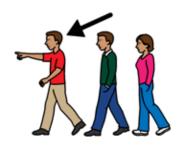

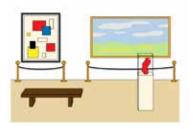

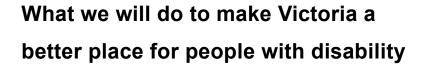
- made a plan to help people with disability get better skills and jobs

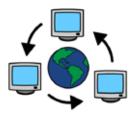
